## Support package: Sudan conflict escalation

Following the rapid conflict escalation in Sudan, the H2H Network has activated its funding mechanism to support the humanitarian response in the affected region. The funding is enabling six H2H Members to provide services aiming to fill gaps and improve the response to better meet humanitarian needs.
