# Support package: Türkiye-Syria earthquake

In response to the devastating earthquakes that hit southeast Türkiye and northwest Syria, H2H Network activates its funding mechanism to strengthen the humanitarian response in the region. The funding enables nine specialized network members to provide services aiming to fill gaps and improve the response to better meet the humanitarian needs.

The package of services includes structural assessments of damaged buildings, repair of critical medical equipment, communication with communities and accountability mechanisms, as well as quality and standards in humanitarian action.

**As part of the funded package, services are freely available to all responders.**

The H2H Network fund allocation is supported by UK aid – from the British people, and the Disaster Emergency Committee (DEC).
