# Support package: Floods in Libya

Following the catastrophic floods in Libya, the H2H Network has activated its fund to support the humanitarian response to the affected population. The funding is enabling five H2H Members to provide services to fill gaps and improve the response to better meet humanitarian needs.

The package of services will address security and safety measurements, rapid needs assessments, communication and engagement with affected people, and access to information.

**As with all H2H-funded projects, services are available for free to all responders.**
