

H2H Network GET READY FUND Support Package

The Get Ready Fund is intended to help members develop processes, systems and services that allow them to adapt and respond faster and more effectively to crises in 2021 and beyond.

Independent organizations providing humanitarian-to-humanitarian technical services are typically small, operating on tight budgets. It can be difficult to scale up and quickly get to work in an emergency. The Covid-19 pandemic and the ensuing impacts on the humanitarian system's traditional ways of working have introduced new challenges – and bring new opportunities to adapt tried-and-tested ways of working.

The H2H Network's new Get Ready Fund aims to help members overcome obstacles and offer their much-needed services quickly, often in new ways. It will support members to develop processes, systems and services that allow them to adapt and respond faster and more effectively in 2021 and beyond.
